A Focus On Social-Emotional Learning



Children learn how to socialize and how to recognize and express emotions by observing those around them. During the pandemic, masking and isolation led to a significant delay in social and emotional development for children across the world.

Thanks to generous assistance from Critchlow donors, we have implemented two new programs to help our children identify and process their emotions. In 2023, we received a grant from the Qlarant Foundation to pilot a yoga program at our White Marsh Site. It was incredibly successful, and in 2024, we received funding from Betty Kenzie and Kim and Linda Cassady to expand the program to all five of our sites.

Additionally, in the summer of 2024, we formed a partnership with Positive Strides Therapeutic Riding Center. Our children have begun visiting the center, and enjoy spending calming time outdoors with the horses.





A Note From Our President

As I look back on all the amazing things your support has made possible for Critchlow Adkins' children and families this past year—from quality educational childcare to enriching summer camps and hands-on STEAM* projects—I'm reminded of just how vital our role in the community is. Your generosity continues to inspire us, making these unique opportunities a reality.



Thanks to you, our students are learning new skills and discovering the joy of giving back. For example, the children at our White Marsh Site raised over \$700 for Talbot Hospice by collecting spare change, while kids at all of our locations made

heartfelt Valentine's cards for nursing home residents and members of the Armed Forces.

Our community partnerships are also growing, offering our students diverse experiences both in and out of the classroom. We're thrilled to have more than 40 partners expanding our children's horizons, including our newest collaboration with Positive Strides Therapeutic Riding, where students learn about horses—their care, equipment, and training.

Of course, none of this would be possible without our incredible staff, who work tirelessly to provide the best for Critchlow's kids. This year, seven of our teachers earned their CDA (Child Development Associate Credential), meeting new standards for Maryland EXCELS programs. Teachers in our 3- and 4-year-old classrooms have also been trained in the University of Maryland's Children Discover Their World curriculum. And we couldn't be prouder of our site directors, Marlene Thomas and Keieve Colbert, who were both nominated as Women to Watch for their leadership and commitment to their children and families!

Childcare funding remains challenging, but your support and various foundation and state grants keep us moving forward. We recently welcomed Comptroller Brooke Lierman and Secretary of Housing and Community Development Jake Day to visit our programs and see Critchlow's impact firsthand.

As the need for childcare grows, we're excited announce we are expanding. Critchlow will soon have three classrooms and space for 30 more students at Chapel District Elementary in Cordova. We can't wait to move out of the cafeteria and into our own space, thanks to the extraordinary donors making this expansion possible! See the article below for more details.

Due to the Chapel District Elementary School renovation, Critchlow Adkins was asked to move our preschool classroom to another location within the school. The relocation and the renovation provided the opportunity, not only to build a new preschool classroom, but to build 2 new school age rooms, a Site Director's office, and a teacher workroom. This expansion eliminates the need to host our school age children in the school cafeteria, and will allow us to

Critchlow Adkins has five sites, located in Cordova, Easton (2), Trappe, and St. Michaels, and serves families from across the Mid-Shore. All sites are accredited by the MD State Department of Education (MSDE), and have earned an Excellence in Early Learning and School Age Care EXCELS Check Level 5 Rating, reserved for the highest quality childcare programs in the state. Critchlow has earned recognition at these levels for more than 30 years.

Staff, Board Members, local delegates, and our visitors shared robust conversations about the importance of early childhood education and the economic impact of



childcare. We are extremely grateful for the opportunity to meet with Comptroller Lierman and Secretary Day and to show them how Janice Adkins and Happy Critchlow's vision to provide high quality, financially accessible childcare has grown, thanks to the generous support of our community!



A Special Honor

Critchlow Adkins is proud to have partnered with Talbot County Public Schools (TCPS) and the Talbot County Judy Center Early Learning Hubs for many years. In the Spring of 2024, we were recognized with their Community Partner of the Year Award.

Over the course of the year, we collaborated with TCPS and the Judy Centers on several high-impact early learning initiatives, with two in particular standing out.

Critchlow Adkins staff provided support and counsel to TCPS as they went through the pre-kindergarten Maryland EXELS (Excellence Counts in Early Learning and School Age Care) and Accreditation process. In addition, we partnered with TCPS and the Judy Centers as part of our Maryland Rebuilds grant to host "Dine and Discovery" sessions for local childcare providers. During these sessions, we provided information about high-quality care and the EXCELS and Accreditation processes, and offered ongoing support.

We would like to express our deepest thanks to TCPS and the Judy Centers. Receiving this award was a true honor for our organization, but we are even more honored by their continued, invaluable partnership.




Critchlow's Lasting Legacy

Lynn Freeburger-Partridge was substitute teaching at St. Michaels Elementary School in 2004 when she heard an announcement directing children to go to Easton Day Care (now Critchlow Adkins Children's Centers) after school. She was delighted to learn that there was a childcare program on school grounds.

As she taught around Talbot County, Lynn discovered that Critchlow Adkins had five childcare sites and was eager to become involved. She became a donor and began attending events. Lynn later joined the Critchlow Adkins Board of Directors, where she served for six years, and she continues to serve on Critchlow committees. When the 1970 Society was established, Lynn became a member. She chose to add Critchlow Adkins to her estate plans because, "If quality, stimulating childcare was important in 2004, it is now critical in 2024 and beyond."
