Four of its five sites are located within TCPS elementary schools, and the fifth site is on TCPS property.

All five Critchlow Adkins sites have earned accreditation from the Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) as well as EXCELS (Excellence Counts in Early Learning and School Age Care) Check Level 5 Ratings. Check Level 5 is reserved for the highest quality childcare centers in the state of Maryland. These are voluntary processes during which childcare centers undergo rigorous evaluation of their facilities and knowing that their children are in a safe, curriculums. They are graded based on criteria such as the use of age-ap-
