



2025 was a year of growth and transition. We expanded programs, invested in staff development, and launched new initiatives to better meet families' needs. These carefully considered investments resulted in a \$127,000 deficit for the fiscal year, which we were able to offset through reserve resources. In addition to our regular Operating Income and Expenses, money was raised for three crucial Capital Projects: Our Cordova Site expansion, the Preschool Site playground renovation (to be completed in late 2025), and the purchase of our new Central Office. Leadership In Bloom

It's not just our Critchlow Adkins Kids who love learning! Our leaders also seek out opportunities to develop new skills that they can bring back to our organization and our classrooms.

Executive Director Cristy Morrell was a member of the 32nd class of the Leadership Maryland Executive Program in 2025. Along with leaders from across the state, she attended five 2-day sessions this year, focused on vital issues impacting Maryland, including economic development, education, health and human services, criminal justice, and the environment.

Additionally, our Easton School Age Site Director, Keieve Colbert, is a member of the 2025 class of Shore Leadership. Keieve joined other emerging leaders from across the Eastern Shore at monthly sessions focused on topics of regional economic interest.



Critchlow Continues To Grow

As Chapel District Elementary School in Cordova underwent renovations, we had the opportunity to build a brand new, expanded site within the school. The staff and children moved into the classrooms in June 2025.

While we previously had a dedicated preschool classroom, our school age activities were located in the cafeteria. Now, we have 3 bright, warm, welcoming, and engaging classrooms where our children can learn, play, and grow. Included in the space is a Site Director's office and a teacher work room.

This vital expansion allows us to serve up to 30 additional children in our before- and after-school care and summer camp programs, supporting even more working families on the Mid-Shore. We will be hosting a ribbon cutting in June of 2026, when the school renovation is complete.

Meet Apprentice Kennedy Grove

Through our partnership with Talbot County Public Schools, we welcomed Kennedy Grove as a student apprentice at our White Marsh Site. Kennedy was curious about teaching and joined the Teaching Academy of Maryland, a cross-campus course housed at St. Michaels Middle High School. She fell in love with teaching through the course and applied to work with Critchlow Adkins as an apprentice.

When asked what she has gained from her experience, Kennedy shared, "I have learned a lot about classroom management and student engagement, but the biggest thing I've learned is confidence. What helped me the most was that all the kids were approachable and fun. The staff helped me gain confidence by helping me learn the ropes and being patient with me."

Kennedy became an official employee at the White Marsh Site for our 2025 summer camp program. She now attends Towson University where she is pursuing a degree in Elementary Education. We are incredibly proud of Kennedy she is going to become a phenomenal teacher!
